	Dense pinkish-purple clusters in summer. Grows to just 10cm high; excellent trough specimen. Rare endemic of NW Turkey; Jurasek collection.

New	The bluish-gray, flat, curling "cowlick onion" leaves just can't be ignored in any garden, including the rockery. Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and a much appreciated late summer bloomer of pink globes. Half the size of the species with leaves reaching 15cm in height.		
A307	Allium thunbergii alba	Sun	\$9
	Just when you think the garden is done for the season, this easy to please gem brightens the day. Forms tidy clumps; stems 20cm high hold clear white blooms until frost.		
A318	Allium thunbergii 'Ozawa'	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Just when you think all plants will have shut down blooming in the fall, this allium wakes up and gives you one last bouquet. And the flowers last for months, even after light frosts! Elegant 'Ozawa' flowers are held about 30cm high; rich purple with reddish undertones. Delicate, grassy leaves don't distract from the blooms. Very easy to grow, and the deer of course don't like them. From Gabriella Costea seed.

New	A high collection ~3300m, Utah; small woody crowned shrub with spreading branches of silvery blue/gray foliage; flowers are small yellow discs on 10cm stems.

New	Long, thin leaves erupting from the base of a thickened stock. The 40cm high flower spikes carry hundreds of stemless white flowers; an accent plant popular with garden visitors.

	Large, and extremely thin petalled purple daisy - that's what makes it striking. A taller alpine, at 20-45 cm. Jurasek collection, N. Qinghai, 3600m.

	Mounds of heart shaped leaves and full purple cupped blooms in summer. Grown from Piatek's seed.		
C148	Campanula chamissonis	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	A species from Japan to Kamchatka and over to Aleutian Is. Bright green clumps of leaves on slowly spreading rhizomes; blue, single flowers with white hairs; for a moist scree or trough.

	Gray-green leaves; huge ivory bells tipped with pink; from Turkey.		
C122	Campanula fenestrellata	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Similar to c. garganica but more compact; doubly toothed leaves; blue flowers; 10cm.

	Light icy purple bells face open upwards, like fine glassware. Although this native of Greece tends to be monocarpic, those who grow it say it's worth it!

	Known as the "white-haired leather-flower". Clumps of non-vining leathery obovate leaves to 45cm tall. Silky, tomentose white urn shaped bells hang singly, followed by feathery seed heads. Grows natively in shale barrens in western Virginia; from Mike Kintgen's seed.

	Non-climbing, erect stems to 40cm.; large blue flowers make a grand display in June followed by equally attractive, fluffy seed heads.

New	Airy bush that grows to about a meter high with a multitude of small fragrant white flowers. Pavelka collection from stony hills in the Kirgizski Range, Tian Shan, Krygizstan.

	Open, coppery yellow blooms in late summer, followed by the decorative woolly clematis seed heads. Deciduous vine grows up to 4m.
