| New          | Toothed, wooly, gray-green leaves form mats with 15cm flower stems that bear corms of pale yellow flowers, which age to cream.  |              |      |

|              | Compact 10cm evergreen mound of soft pink blooms. Easy to grow and will gently self seed about. Jurasek collection from Turkey.   |              |      |
| <b>A0092</b> | <b>Aethionema grandiflorum</b>  | Sun Part-sun | \$11 |
|              | Sub shrub growing to 25cm. A lot of pink flowers ~1.5cm; from Turkey.   |              |      |
| <b>A0005</b> | <b>Aethionema ibirideum</b>   | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
|              | Small growing crucifer with trailing stems forming loose mats; blue gray leaves and maroon stems; pink, fragrant flowers.   |              |      |
| <b>A0280</b> | <b>Aethionema saxatilis</b>   | Sun          | \$11 |
| New          | Blue-green, thick (almost succulent like) leaves form a low cushion of 10-15cm. Flowers are usually pink, but there is variability with white and mauve as well. Jurasek collection, 1700m Greece.        |              |      |
| <b>A0198</b> | <b>Aethionema subulatum</b>   | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
| New          | Compact tufts of woody stems with bluish leaves; large rose/pink flowers on short scapes.   |              |      |
| <b>A0394</b> | <b>Agave havardiana</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Gorgeous 60cm blue-gray succulent basal rosette. Very sharp, dark spines. Alplains Davis Mountain collection; Jeff Davis CO., TX, 1860m. Listed for Zone 6-7.   |              |      |
| <b>A0199</b> | <b>Agave lechuguilla</b>  | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Found at 1494m, El Paso Co., Texas. This is a hardy collection with typical dagger like stems and etched patterning.  |              |      |
| <b>A0006</b> | <b>Agave parryi</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | A hardy Alplains collection from Grant Co., NM at 2073m, where it experiences a good amount of winter cold.   |              |      |
| <b>A0408</b> | <b>Allium caesium</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Elegant 20-40cm stems of pale azure blue globes that hold up for a good long time in mid-summer. For sunny, well drained spot in the garden. M. Pavelka collection at 2400m, Tian-Shan, Kyrgyzstan.       |              |      |
| <b>A0437</b> | <b>Allium carolinianum</b>  | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
| New          | From Himalayan slopes; broad, glaucous leaves with round heads of pink flowers in early summer.   |              |      |
| <b>A0382</b> | <b>Allium cupanii ssp. hirtovaginatum</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Tuft of linear leaves, just 5-10cm in height. Large pink flowers, varying from light to dark pink in colour. Choice collection by M. Pavelka; Ulu Dag, Turkey.  |              |      |
| <b>A0397</b> | <b>Allium cyathophorum v. farreri</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Strong growing tight clump of grassy leaves from northern China. Late spring nodding clusters; dark pink flowers with very pointed petals; 20cm high.   |              |      |
| <b>A0219</b> | <b>Allium forrestii</b>   | Sun          | \$14 |
|              | A diminutive species growing at 4500m on the rocky slopes of Beima Shan, Yunnan; big red/purple flowers on short stems.   |              |      |
| <b>A0357</b> | <b>Allium insubricum</b>  | Sun          | \$14 |
| New          | The Lombardy Garlic, named for the N. Italy region it is endemic to. Umbels of nodding rosy flowers in summer; flat, grass like leaves to 25cm high.  |              |      |
| <b>A0288</b> | <b>Allium kurtzianum</b>  | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Dense pinkish-purple clusters in summer. Grows to just 10cm high; excellent trough specimen. Rare endemic of NW Turkey; J. Jurasek collection.  |              |      |
| <b>A0441</b> | <b>Allium macedonicum</b>   | Sun          | \$14 |
| New          | Elegant umbels of striped light pink/yellow florets on 15-40 cm stems. For dry, sunny garden with good drainage and neutral to alkaline soil. M. Rejzek collection from Babuna, North Macedonia at 1250m. |              |      |

|              | Stems (60cm) hold dense, oval, drumstick flower heads, oddly resembling maroon-red clover. Grassy leaves are elegant, thin and about 40cm in height. M. Rejzek collection from Ereğ Dagi, Turkey at 2000m.   |              |      |
| <b>A0307</b> | <b>Allium thunbergii alba</b>  | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Just when you think the garden is done for the season, this easy to please gem brightens the day. Forms tidy clumps; stems 20cm high hold clear white blooms until frost.  |              |      |
| <b>A0318</b> | <b>Allium thunbergii 'Ozawa'</b>   | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
| New          | Late blooming flowers last for months, even after light frosts! Elegant 'Ozawa' flowers are held about 30cm high; rich purple with reddish undertones. Delicate, grassy leaves don't distract from the blooms. Very easy to grow, and the deer of course don't like them. From Gabriella Costea seed.  |              |      |
| <b>A0194</b> | <b>Allium virgunculae</b>  | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | A very dainty 10cm allium with thin green leaves in a neat tuft bearing blue/purple flowers in the autumn until frost.   |              |      |
| <b>A0439</b> | <b>Alyssum haussknechtii</b>   | Sun          | \$14 |
| New          | Extremely choice and tiny (2-4cm) silver cushion covered in yellow flowers. M. Pavelka collection from Tahtali Dag, Turkey rocky slopes.   |              |      |
| <b>A0324</b> | <b>Alyssum oxycarpum</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
| New          | Tiny grey green leaves with profusion of yellow blooms. 20cm high mounds naturalize and brighten garden edges in summer.   |              |      |
| <b>A0008</b> | <b>Alyssum propinquum</b>  | Sun          | \$12 |
| New          | Condensed mats of gray/green leaves and stems. Mostly spring flowering, they do resume growth and blooming from September onwards, staying evergreen through the winter and often flowering through the snow. Tolerant of heat and cold; very effective in combination with Acantholimon and Dianthus. |              |      |
| <b>A0137</b> | <b>Andromeda polifolia Ft. Chimo</b>   | Sun          | \$13 |
| New          | A collection from northern Canada which has proven to be a good grower; needle like leaves of bluish green; pink flowers; 30cm.  |              |      |

| New          | Clusters of 2-4 pink flowers on small green cushions, shiny, pointed leaves. 2400m; Sar Planina, Macedonia.  |              |      |
| <b>A0118</b> | <b>Androsace muscoidea</b>   | Sun Part-sun | \$16 |
|              | Very choice, silvery green, stoloniferous cushion; stemless lavender flowers; from drier regions of the Himalaya.  |              |      |
| <b>A0010</b> | <b>Androsace primuloides 'Sheppard'</b>  | Sun Part-sun | \$14 |
|              | Large vigorous plant with many gray-green rosettes of elliptical leaves, each one producing, in May, a compact umbel of pink flowers with a yellow eye, lovely where given the room to form a solid carpet.  |              |      |

|              | From a wild collection at 3300m, Garwal. Soft cushions of lanate leaves, rose/pink flowers with a dark eye; spreads into larger mats.  |              |      |

|              | A neat, mat forming species with deep green, succulent leaves. Bright pink flowers on short stems.   |              |      |

|              | Excellent dwarf form. Mats of dark green leaves. Delicate pink lanterns followed by red fruits.   |              |      |

| New          | Grassy, liner leaves form a tight 5-10cm cushion. Jurasek collection from Gansu at 4200m.   |              |      |

|              | Large white flowers on a dense tuft, just 5-15cm in height. For well drained, neutral to alkaline scree in full sun. M. Rejzek collection from Alpes Maritimes, France at 1250m.  |              |      |
| <b>A0377</b> | <b>Arenaria hookeri v. desertorum</b>   | Sun          | \$15 |
| New          | Very choice, tight, cushion with exceptionally fine needle like leaves; becomes a mound of white blooms in early summer. Alplains collection from Uintah Co., UT at 2302m.  |              |      |
| <b>A0312</b> | <b>Arenaria obtusiloba</b>  | Sun          | \$15 |
|              | Mats of trailing stems with tufts of short needles. White blooms in late spring to early summer. Alplains collection from Albany Co., WY, 3310m.  |              |      |
| <b>A0025</b> | <b>Arenaria tetraquetra</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Dense, hard green mat of tetragonous leaves; many white, stem-less flowers in May. Use as a mat to intergrow with something larger such as dianthus or bulbs.   |              |      |
| <b>A0095</b> | <b>Arenaria tetraquetra ssp. granatensis</b>  | Sun          | \$14 |
| New          | One of the tightest mats I have seen; ground hugging little hummocks of light green and gold; especially attractive growing on tufa. The white flowers are stemless ~1cm wide. Excellent for combining with other mats or to use as a "dry" underplant for bulbs or a small alpine campanula, gentian or primula. |              |      |
| <b>A0228</b> | <b>Arenaria 'Turkish Frost'</b>   | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
|              | Grown from seed from a Czech collection in Turkey, this is not keyed out, but is so good that it must be listed. Narrow blades of grey/green form a dwarf, soft mound; many white flowers with distinctive purple striping are borne in the heat of summer making a valued addition at this time of year; 6cm.    |              |      |
| <b>A0051</b> | <b>Arenaria Wallowa Mts</b>   | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
|              | Solid green hummocks with white flowers on 1 inch stems. A very tight, wonderful cushion.   |              |      |
| <b>A0401</b> | <b>Armeria canescens</b>  | Sun          | \$11 |
|              | Taller thrift in bloom, 20-30cm, yet still elegant with its pink globes held high above the moppish mounds of long linear leaves. Collection from Montenegro.   |              |      |
| <b>A0376</b> | <b>Armeria girardii</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | Grassy tufts of narrow leaves; small pink globes held on threadlike stems; 8-15cm high. Specific to the Caucasus and Dolomite sands; a M. Rejzek collection from Cevennes, France at 1000m.   |              |      |
| <b>A0028</b> | <b>Armeria juniperifolia</b>  | Sun Part-sun | \$12 |
|              | Hummock forming Spanish Thrift, very compact; lot's of pink flowers on 5cm stems.   |              |      |
| <b>A0029</b> | <b>Armeria juniperifolia 'Alba'</b>   | Sun          | \$12 |
|              | A white flowered version with more glaucous leaves and condensed habit. It does best in very dry sand and full sun.   |              |      |

|              | A diminutive form, very compact making the cushion almost hard. Stemless rose pink pompoms cover it in early spring.  |              |      |
