	Dense pinkish-purple clusters in summer. Grows to just 10cm high; excellent trough specimen. Rare endemic of NW Turkey; J. Jurasek collection.

New	Elegant umbels of striped light pink/yellow florets on 15-40 cm stems. For dry, sunny garden with good drainage and neutral to alkaline soil. M. Rejzek collection from Babuna, North Macedonia at 1250m.

	Pink flowered allium; from Jurasek seed collected in Rawu, E. Tibet at 4100m.		
A0362	Allium senescens ssp. glaucum	Sun	\$12
	The bluish-gray, flat, curling "cowlick onion" leaves just can't be ignored in any garden, including the rockery. Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and a much appreciated late summer bloomer of pink globes. Half the size of the species with leaves reaching 15cm in height.		
A0284	Allium sikkimense	Sun	\$14
	Very desirable thin leaved, petite blue allium for rock garden and trough. A more than welcome bloom in August and September.		
A0386	Allium sphaerocephalon	Sun	\$12
	Stems (60cm) hold dense, oval, drumstick flower heads, oddly resembling maroon-red clover. Grassy leaves are elegant, thin and about 40cm in height. M. Rejzek collection from Ereğ Dagi, Turkey at 2000m.		
A0307	Allium thunbergii alba	Sun	\$12
	Just when you think the garden is done for the season, this easy to please gem brightens the day. Forms tidy clumps; stems 20cm high hold clear white blooms until frost.		
A0318	Allium thunbergii 'Ozawa'	Sun Part-sun	\$12
New	Late blooming flowers last for months, even after light frosts! Elegant 'Ozawa' flowers are held about 30cm high; rich purple with reddish undertones. Delicate, grassy leaves don't distract from the blooms. Very easy to grow, and the deer of course don't like them. From Gabriella Costea seed.

	Tiny (10-15cm), grassy onion from Japan; pale lavender-pink blooms in August.		
A0194	Allium virgunculae	Sun	\$12
	A very dainty 10cm allium with thin green leaves in a neat tuft bearing blue/purple flowers in the autumn until frost.		
A0436	Alyssum armenum	Sun	\$14
	Large yellow flowers on 5-10cm subshrub of small grey leaves. M. Pavelka collection from gypsum hills, Palandoken, Turkey.		
A0008	Alyssum propinquum	Sun	\$14
New	Condensed mats of gray/green leaves and stems. Mostly spring flowering, they do resume growth and blooming from September onwards, staying evergreen through the winter and often flowering through the snow. Tolerant of heat and cold; very effective in combination with Acantholimon and Dianthus.

	Halda collected seed of this species in Upper Burma on Mali Kha in a high alpine pasture (4800m); stemless, lavender flowers sit atop tight cushions of hairy leaves, resembling a miniature form of a. muscoidea, very choice introduction.

	Small rosettes of stiff green leaves topped with rose coloured flowers; the best form of this variable species, it makes tight, compact cushions from northerly and drier Quinghai.

	Very choice, silvery green, stoloniferous cushion; stemless lavender flowers; from drier regions of the Himalaya.

	Large vigorous plant with many gray-green rosettes of elliptic leaves, each one producing, in May, a compact umbel of pink flowers with a yellow eye, lovely where given the room to form a solid carpet.

	From a wild collection at 3300m, Garwal. Soft cushions of lonate leaves, rose/pink flowers with a dark eye; spreads into larger mats.

New	A neat, mat forming species with deep green, succulent leaves. Bright pink flowers on short stems.		
A0162	Androsace tanggulashanensis	Sun	\$16
	Tiny, tiny rosettes in dense clusters; stemless, white flowers; choice. From limestone grassy screes; Madoi.		
A0014	Androsace villosa v. jacquemontii	Part-sun	\$16
New	Originally from Ota Vlasak, this collection is stoloniferous and mat forming, but slow. Flowers are a vivid red-purple with greenish yellow eyes, quite striking.

	Late spring flower colour can vary from strawberry pink to purple and white. Lanate leaves with flower stems 10-20cm stems high.		
A0098	Anemone parviflora	Sun Part-sun	\$14
	Dark green, basal leaves; short stems bearing bluish/white flowers.		
A0442	Anemone sp. JJ21.51	Sun Part-sun	\$16
New	Small yellow flowers, like a ranunculus, on 15cm stems. Jurasek collection from China at 3800m.

New	A fine pink flowered form. Makes dense carpets of green and silver.

New	From Turkey, an absolutely flat mat with filigreed silvery green leaves and white flowers; the best form.

	J. Jurasek collection from Montenegro; low, compact cushions of grey/green; light pink flowers on short stems that hug the earth; 8cm.

	The Golden Columbine, a vigorous 40cm clump of ferny foliage, crowned in 7cm lemon yellow blooms mid-summer. Native of the southern Rocky Mountains.

	Endemic to the Front Range in Colorado, this is a choice and petite columbine. Nodding flowers are a bright blue-purple and white; tidy blue-green leaves.

New	Minute 10cm plants of gray-green leaves; dwarfed by the large, blue and white, long spurred flowers. Choice Alplains collection from east-facing steep screes of dolomite in Piute Co., UT, 3338m.

New	The flowers are that of the typical four petaled white Arabis, but the tight 4cm high cushion looks for all the world like a silvery Androsace villosa. Nice specimen for an alkaline, gritty crevice or trough. M. Rejzek collection from Bolkar Daglari, Turkey, 2760m.		
A0287	Arabis bryoides	Sun Part-sun	\$14
New	Tidy, tight cushion of heavily tomentose leaves giving it a soft appearance. Covered in white flowers in spring.		
A0041	Arctostaphylos uva ursi 'Wood's Red'	Sun	\$15
	Excellent dwarf form. Mats of dark green leaves. Delicate pink lanterns followed by red fruits.		
A0371	Arenaria grandiflora	Sun	\$13
	Large white flowers on a dense tuft, just 5-15cm in height. For well drained, neutral to alkaline scree in full sun. M. Rejzek collection from Alpes Maritimes, France at 1250m.		
A0377	Arenaria hookeri v. desertorum	Sun	\$16
	Very choice, tight, cushion with exceptionally fine needle like leaves; becomes a mound of white blooms in early summer. Alplains collection from Uintah Co., UT at 2302m.

	Hard hemispherical cushions with stemless starry white flowers, like the tightest of kabschia saxifrages. Jurasek collection from Central Sichuan, 4400m.

	One of the tightest mats I have seen; ground hugging little hummocks of light green and gold; especially attractive growing on tufa. The white flowers are stemless ~1cm wide. Excellent for combining with other mats or to use as a "dry" underplant for bulbs or a small alpine campanula, gentian or primula.		
A0228	Arenaria 'Turkish Frost'	Sun Part-sun	\$13
	Grown from seed from a Czech collection in Turkey, this is not keyed out, but is so good that it must be listed. Narrow blades of grey/green form a dwarf, soft mound; many white flowers with distinctive purple striping are borne in the heat of summer making a valued addition at this time of year; 6cm.		
A0051	Arenaria Wallowa Mts	Sun Part-sun	\$13
	Solid green hummocks with white flowers on 1 inch stems. A very tight, wonderful cushion.		
A0028	Armeria juniperifolia	Sun Part-sun	\$13
	Hummock forming Spanish Thrift, very compact; lots of pink flowers on 5cm stems.		
A0029	Armeria juniperifolia 'Alba'	Sun	\$13
	A white flowered version with more glaucous leaves and condensed habit. It does best in very dry sand and full sun.		
A0030	Armeria juniperifolia 'Bevan's Variety'	Sun Part-sun	\$15
	A diminutive form, very compact making the cushion almost hard. Stemless rose pink pompoms cover it in early spring.		
A0049	Armeria x 'Little Penny'	Sun	\$13
New	A tiny armeria with stemless crimson pink flowers on a tight mound of red-purple foliage.		
A0181	Artemisia frigida	Sun	\$14
	A high collection ~3300m, Utah; small woody crowned shrub with spreading branches of silvery blue/gray foliage; flowers are small yellow discs on 10cm stems.		
A0435	Artemisia stelleriana 'Mori's Strain'	Sun	\$14
New	Attractive prostrate form; 20cm mound of white, pinnatifid leaves. For well drained rockery in full sun.		
A0193	Artemisia 'tiny green'	Sun Part-sun	\$14
New	Unusual mat of green filigreed leaves in tiny marble sized balls.		
A0222	Aruncus aethusifolius	Sun Part-sun Shade	\$12
	Native to Japan and Korea; low mounds of finely divided leaves with airy plumes of white flowers over a long period; tolerates dry, shaded sites.		
A0044	Asperula gussonii	Sun	\$14
New	Frosted hard dome topped with long tubular pink flowers.		
A0063	Asperula pontica	Sun	\$14
New	Dense cushion of green curls with a touch of frost on the margins. Long tubes of dark pink; excellent for crevice or trough.

	Long, thin leaves erupting from the base of a thickened stock. The 40cm high flower spikes carry hundreds of stemless white flowers; an accent plant popular with garden visitors.

	Hot magenta blooms from August to September. Only ~20cm tall.

	Tidy 30cm mound, multitude of purple flowers with yellow centres in late summer to early fall. Disease resistant.		
A0462	Aster ericoides f. prostratum 'Snow Flurry'	Sun	\$13
	Pure white shrubby mat of tiny daisies in late summer to fall, when nothing else dare bloom. Striking hanging over rock walls, or as undergrowth amongst taller, upright garden plants.

New	A Josef Halda collection from the 2700m in Altai Mts. bordering the Gobi Desert. Short tufts of gray/green leaves amongst dolomitic rocks; large lavender/blue flowers on short stems, at ~6cm. Suitable for a trough.		
A0463	Aster sp. 'Datong Shan'	Sun	\$14
	Large daisy with long, pine needle like purple petals on a short stem; 10-30cm. M. Rejzek collection from Datong Shan, Qinghai, China at 3780m. For full sun, well draining loam or clay.		
A0036	Astilbe simplicifolia 'Willie Buchanan'	Sun Part-sun Shade	\$11
	Very low with sharply toothed leaves; pale pink flowers.		
A0043	Astragalus angustifolius	Sun	\$15
	Received from Fred Case, this woody plant makes an excellent mat of silver divided leaves and white pea flowers. Easy to grow, and excellent draped over rocks.		
A0039	Aubrieta gracilis	Sun Part-sun	\$13
	Mats of tiny green leaves; profuse, purple flowers in May.		
A0360	Azalea japonica 'Kermesina Rosea'	Part-sun	\$18
	Unusual and striking pink flowers with clear white margins, cover this compact shrub in late spring. Small, dark green leaves; shrubby mound reaches just 60cm in height after 10 years.		
A0265	Azorella trifurcata	Sun Part-sun	\$13
	Ground hugging mats of hard, rubbery foliage. Tiny yellow/green flowers sit on the carpet.		
B0025	Bergenia crassifolia	Sun Part-sun Shade	\$12
	Clump of leathery, obovate leaves, to about 30cm tall. Panicles of pink flowers in spring. Grow in moist, humus rich soil; even tolerates full shade. Eastern Sayan Mountains, E. Siberia at 2100m.		
B0015	Besseyia alpina	Part-sun	\$13
New	Deep violet flowered bottlebrush spikes reach just 15cm in summer. Basal rosettes of ovate tiny toothed leaves. Alplains collection; 3887m, Park Co., CO.		
B0012	Besseyia wyomingensis	Sun	\$13
	Delightful purple 'kittentails' on woolly spikes in early spring. Alplains collection from steep east facing limestone slope; Teton Co., MT, 2348m.		
B0022	Bupleurum ranunculoides	Sun	\$13
	Grassy leaves in a mound; clusters of dill like yellow flowers on stems 40cm high.		
C0186	Calceolaria polyrhiza	Sun Part-sun	\$12
New	From the high steppes of southern Chile and Argentina; woody, stoloniferous clumps with lanceolate leaves topped with large golden flowers spotted with red, 2-5 on a stem. Grows in dry or damp sandy, gravelly soils, 12 cm high in bloom.		
C0290	Calluna vulgaris 'Dainty Bess'	Sun Part-sun	\$12
	Just 10cm in height; grey green leaves with soft mauve flowers in late summer to fall.		
C0227	Calluna vulgaris 'Fire Star'	Sun Part-sun	\$12
	Mauve flowers in August and September; brilliant yellow/orange foliage. Grows up to 30cm.		
C0195	Calluna vulgaris 'Firefly'	Sun Part-sun	\$12
	New growth of bright lime green transforms to red/copper tones by September and remains so through winter. Tiny mauve flowers hug the stems in summer.		
C0234	Calluna vulgaris 'Foxii Nana'	Sun	\$12
	Diminutive heather (10-15cm tall) with tidy dense foliage. Mauve flowers in fall.

	Gold foliage turns coppery orange in winter; grows to 30-45cm high; summer lavender blooms.		
C0243	Calluna vulgaris 'Humpty Dumpty'	Sun Part-sun	\$12
New	Very dwarf, growing to no more than 10cm in height. Bright green stunted foliage, perfect for a rock garden. Though grown mostly for its miniature form, it does give many white blooms in late summer.		
C0264	Calluna vulgaris 'Jana'	Sun	\$12
	Stunning double red, late summer blooms; grows to 40cm high.		
C0246	Calluna vulgaris 'John F. Letts'	Sun	\$12
New	Only 10cm mat, with lavender blooms through autumn. Foliage is quite attractive with tonal changes throughout the seasons - from gold in summer to bronzey reds in winter.		
C0266	Calluna vulgaris 'Soay'	Sun	\$12
New	Choice, unusual and tiny Calluna, 10cm in height, with green and red leaves; mauve flowers. Named after an island in St. Kilda region.
